



## **Legal Fellow Sought For Spring 2018 Semester!**

Legal Fellow at the Wage Justice Center will work on litigation combatting the epidemic of wage-theft faced by immigrant workers in California. We handle a large volume of active litigation, involving both direct services and impact litigation.

Our cases consist of both traditional wage-and-hour litigation and the innovative use of commercial debtor-creditor law and corporation's law to unwind corporate fraud, enforce wage judgments and attack schemes use by businesses to evade liability for wage claims. We work closely with community and labor organizations seeking to improve working conditions in a variety of low-wage industries.

Externs who volunteer at the Wage Justice Center will staff parts of many cases, with an emphasis on effective wage theft judgment enforcement strategies. Assignments incorporate an interplay of litigation and public records investigations.

Externs receive training on civil litigation, corporate law, judgment enforcement and bankruptcy. Work entails all facets of litigation including drafting pleadings, client interaction, strategy formulation (and implementation), legal research, discovery and shadowing attorneys in court or deposition as available.
